

AUTHOR GUIDELINES

This document provides author guidelines for writing papers for the 15th International Scientific Conference EEE 2026. Paper should be written in the same format in which this document is written. Please abide to the following instructions.

THE TITLE OF THE PAPER ***FONT TIMES NEW ROMAN 16 PT BOLD, ITALIC, SPACING*** ***BEFORE 30 PT, AFTER 30 PT, CENTER, FIRST LINE 0***

Times New Roman TNR, 10 pt Italic, spacing before 6 pt, after 6 pt, center, first line 0

ABSTRACT ***TNR 14 PT, BOLD ITALIC, ALIGN LEFT SPACING BEFORE 24 PT,*** ***AFTER 24 PT, CENTER, FIRST LINE 0***

The abstract should have a maximum of 200 words, font TNR 11 pt, italic, justified.

*After the text of the abstract, type **keywords** and **JEL classification**.*

Keywords (TNR 11 pt Bold, Italic): Keyword 1, Keyword 2, Keyword 3, Keyword 4, Keyword 5 (maximum 5 words)

JEL Classification (TNR 11 pt Bold, Italic): 2-digit number (e.g. M26)

INTRODUCTION

The paper cannot be shorter than 6 (six) nor longer than 10 (ten) pages.

One author can write a maximum of 2 (two) papers.

The maximum number of authors on a paper is 3 (three).

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

The paper should be written in English, in MS Word (Times New Roman - TNR 11 pt normal) and in A4 format (210 mm x 297 mm).

All margins (top, bottom, left and right) should be 2,5 cm.

Write the text exclusively in one column with single spacing (TNR, 11 pt, normal, justified alignment, first line – 0.7 cm, spacing – before = 3 pt, after = 3 pt, line spacing – single, upper and lower case).

Type the beginning of a paragraph without using Tabs or spaces.
Separate the chapter text from the chapter title with one blank line.

TABLES

Each table should be numbered in ascending order, starting with number 1.

The title of the table should be written above the table and centered, font TNR 11 pt, Italic, Spacing after 12 pt, after 12 pt, keep with next.

The table should look like this:

Do not make the title of the table and its number bold.

PICTURES (IMAGES)

Each image should be numbered in ascending order, starting with number 1.

The image title should be written below the image and centered, TNR 11 pt font.

Please do not insert a text box above or below the image.

The image should look like this:

The title of the picture and its number should not be bolded.

ENUMERATION IN THE TEXT

If you use bullet points in your text, please follow the instructions below:

Enumeration by points

- Move the text to the left 0.7 cm, hanging 0.3 cm, spacing before 6 pt, after 6 pt
- Use TNR 11 pt font.

Enumeration by numbers

1. Turn off auto numbering and separate the number from the text by pressing the TAB key, move the text to the left 0.7 cm, hanging 0.55 cm, spacing before 6 pt, after 6 pt,
2. Use the font TNR 11 pt.

CITATION OF THE AUTHOR IN THE PAPER

Reference with one author: (Stojanović, 2016, p.124)

Reference from two authors: (Stojanović & Petrović, 2016, p.124)

Reference with three or more authors: (Stojanović et al., 2016, p. 124)

Organizations – authors of the publication: (Ministry of Education, 2007, p. 5; OECD, 2023)

Laws, rules, regulations: (Official Gazette of RS No. 36/2009, 88/2010, 14/2016 and 95/2018)

Adding references from Wikipedia: It is not recommended to use data from Wikipedia

EQUATIONS

Equations should be aligned 5 mm from the left margin, and the serial number of the equation should be aligned with the right margin.

Equations should be written in TNR 11 pt font, and ordinal numbers should be written in ordinary parentheses in TNR 11 pt font.

Use Microsoft Equation to write equations.

$$R_a = 0,65 \cdot R_{\max}^{0,9} \quad (1)$$

CONCLUSION

Do not number the pages in your paper, do not use headers and footnotes.

LITERATURE

References in the text are cited in APA style (<https://apastyle.apa.org/about-apa-style>).

The list of literature should be listed at the end of the work and only those literary sources that are cited in the work (font TNR 11 pt, spacing before 6 pt, after 6 pt).

The list of references (literature) lists all the materials used in the work, that is, mentioned somewhere in the work.

It is mandatory to check whether all references from the text of the paper are listed in the literature.

Book with one author:

A book with two authors:

A book with more than two authors:

Rokai, P., Djere, Z., Pal, T., & Kasas, A. (2002). *History of the Hungarians*. Belgrade: Clio.

Book, translation of part:

Spitz, E. H. (2011). *Art and Psyche: A Study in Psychoanalysis and Aesthetics*. (A. Nikšić, trans.). Belgrade: Clio.

Book with editor, proceedings:

Đurković, M. (ed.) (2007). *Serbia 2000-2006: state, society, economy*. Belgrade: Institute for European Studies.

Paper from the proceedings:

Radović, Z. (2007). Adoption of the constitution. In: Đurković, M. (ed.) (2007). *Serbia 2000-2006: state, society, economy* (pp. 27-38). Belgrade: Institute for European Studies.

Paper from a scientific journal:

Đurić, S. (2010). Quality control of qualitative research. *Sociological Review*, 44, 485-502.

Paper from an online scientific journal:
